

Plan for Improvement and Development:

Our priorities for improvement and development for the coming year focus are split into four key areas;

Standards, Curriculum, Resources and Leadership

Our recent National test results and 2019 Parent and Pupil Questionnaire feedback have been used to decide upon the priorities for improvement:

Standards

1. To increase the number of pupils achieving expected level of attainment in reading and writing at the end of Key Stage 1 to at least National average.
2. To increase the number of pupils achieving expected level of attainment in maths at the end of Key Stage 1 to at least National average.
3. To ensure that a continued high number of children reach at least expected standards at the end of Key Stage 2
4. To monitor the progress made by all children in Year 3 with attention to those with special educational needs.

Curriculum

1. To increase the focus on the teaching of science at Key Stage 1.
2. To ensure the curriculum is carefully planned using the International Primary Curriculum resources to ensure that it is broad and ambitious
3. To reintroduce and redesign School Council and Sharing Circles to ensure pupil voice is fully valued

Resources

1. To implement and complete the refresh of computers and IT equipment
2. To complete the Daily Mile track to enable use for all pupils throughout the year

Leadership

1. To ensure Governors are fully aware of the new Ofsted framework and its implications for the school
2. To ensure that Governors are trained and regularly monitor the SIDP and SEF

2019 National Test results:

The school has small cohorts which have a fluctuating ratio of boys to girls and a high percentage of SEND pupils in some year groups. This impacts significantly upon data analysis for all groups.

Early Years—71% of pupils achieved a 'good level of development' The National Average was 72%

Year 1 Phonics Screening—80% of pupils passed phonics screening at the end of Year 1 The National Average was 82%

Key stage 1- 54% of pupils met the expected standard in Reading, **45%** in Writing and **54%** in Maths.

Once again, our Key stage 2 results show what fantastic progress children achieve at Langham. With all results for reading writing and maths far exceeding national averages. Key stage 2- 82% of pupils taking the tests at the end of Year 6 met the expected standard or higher in Reading, Writing and Maths. The National Average was 65%,
