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The Eco Council

The Eco Council have been involved in litter picks both on the school site and in Langham. They completed an amazing beach clean at Holkham with 'Surfers Against Sewage.' The Council are in charge of ensuring that we are recycling all our rubbish correctly and they are

making sure that we reduce our single use plastic in school. We are working towards a plastic free schools status. They are about to write our 'Eco Code.' We have had one trip to the Wetlands area in Langham where we learnt about the journey of our water.

Coral and Amber Class are going next month. We also have an environmental trip to Sculthorpe Moor Nature Reserve which is run by the national charity, Hawk and Owl Trust, founded to conserve and protect wild birds of prey. Eco Council would like to raise some money for bird boxes containing cameras and other wildlife resources, this is their next exciting project.

Attendance

It is vital that, when your child is well they make every school minute count. Please can you ensure that your child is in school and on time everyday.

They should arrive between 8.30 and 8.45 in the morning.

Government departments track school attendance figures. It is considered that attendance of 90% or below is **persistent absence** which will be closely monitored by school staff.

Langham Village School have a whole school attendance target which is 95%.

- If your child is unwell and you are unsure whether to send them to school, contact the office.
- Avoid taking any holidays during term times (Fixed Penalties apply)
- Keep up to date with what % attendance your child has so that you know if they are at risk of persistent absence. Office staff can provide this for you and it will be reported to you at the end of the year.
- Speak to school staff with any concerns.

Talk to your child about the importance of them being in school and let them know how important **you** feel it is.
